### ANNUAL WRITTEN REPORTS

## NEW P1 INTAKE INDUCTION DAYS

Congratulations to our new intake who all coped very well on their first day in school in May.

Our next induction day for all new pupils entering P1 is Tuesday 6th June at 1.30pm. Parents should meet staff at the P1 entrance. Staff will then help children assemble in class lines in the playground and parents can leave the children with their teacher until 2.30pm. Our new P1 classes will join us again on  $22^{nd}$  June at 1.30pm when all classes in the school will 'move up' to meet their new teacher.



#### PRIMARY 7 END OF YEAR ARRANGEMENTS

Primary 7 will be invited to attend induction days at their chosen High School this term.

Children attending Bannerman High in August will attend for 3 days on  $13^{th}$ ,  $14^{th}$ ,  $15^{th}$  of June. Parents of children attending are also invited to attend an information evening on Monday  $12^{th}$  June at 6.30pm in Bannerman High School.



Children attending an alternative High School will receive notification directly from the school with dates of induction days for their establishment.

Our P7 Leavers' Service will take place in Mure Memorial Church on Monday 26th June at 1.30pm. If you requested tickets for this service, these have been issued. If you have not yet requested tickets you must do so before  $7^{th}$  June.

Our P7 Disco will take place 7-9pm on the evening of Monday 26th in our assembly hall. The children have decided that a music festival theme was the best idea, so let's hope the sun shines warmly for them and no mud is required!

### SCHOOL UNIFORM

Our school uniform is important to us in Garrowhill. We believe the wearing of school uniform helps prevent discrimination and promotes positive relationships and engagement in school life and community. Dressing for success is part of our school ethos and contributes to the development of a good work ethic in our children.

Our uniform is a white shirt, school tie, grey trousers/skirt, burgundy school cardigan or sweatshirt and black/dark school shoes. Parents and children also have the option of wearing a white polo shirt with a school sweatshirt. All children should have a pair of indoor shoes for wearing around the school. If wearing a white polo shirt and sweatshirt we do ask that it is badged, otherwise children cannot be distinguished from other schools when we are out on trips. Badged uniform items can be ordered from Logoxpres.

On PE days all children must change into shorts, t-shirt and gym shoes. Children may wear their indoor shoes as gym shoes or bring a separate pair of trainers for PE. This is personal choice for children and their families. It is not appropriate for children to wear brightly coloured trainers as outdoor footwear and part of their uniform. Please make sure all items of clothing are labeled with your child's name.

No jewellery should be worn during PE lessons. Thank you for your continued efforts in ensuring good standards are maintained.

### HOME LEARNING

As we enter the last three weeks of this school session all home learning journals will be retained in school with examples of excellent practice and effort being put on display around our school. No further home learning tasks will be issued but we do ask that you continue to promote reading, writing and counting with your child throughout the month of June and the holiday period.

We have had some very innovative support from parents this session and we appreciate the feedback we have had from parents on the implementation of our new policy. Thank you especially to the members of our focus group this session who have helped us develop plans for raising attainment and further developing home learning. I hope they will continue to work with us next session as we focus on phonics, reading and digital learning. If you would like to join this group or feel you can contribute to any aspect of our improvement plans, please let us know.



#### JUNE ELECTIONS

On June 8<sup>th</sup> the school will be used as a polling place for the General Election. Following consultation with the Constituency Manager, it was agreed that it would not be appropriate for children to attend school on this day. Staff will use this time for further in-service training in the building.

All parents are advised to make alternative child care arrangements for Thursday 8th June.

### FLOOD DAMAGE

Sadly our school was badly damaged last Saturday as a result of the heavy rains and thunder storms. A section of the upper corridor ceiling has had to be removed and replaced and the flooring and some furnishings are water damaged. We have also lost many of the novels studied in P4-7 classes.

We are extremely grateful to the Cordia Staff who worked over the holiday weekend alongside the City Building Team to make sure school could re-open as usual this week.

Over the summer holidays further repairs will be carried out and parts of corridor will be re-painted.

## SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT PLAN AND STANDARDS AND QUALITY REPORT

Our School Improvement Plan for 2017-2018 is currently being articulated based on the views expressed by parents/carers and from pupil and staff self-evaluation. Our plan will include the details of we intend to further raised attainment using the additional funding from the Scottish Government's Pupil Equity Fund.

As we move forward we will continue to develop approaches to inclusion and growth mind-set as part of our work to continue to raise attainment and achievement. Sustainable learning continues to be a priority for us next session and we want to focus our effort to improving approaches to literacy with particular emphasis on phonics, writing and grammar. The Improvement Plan and Standards and Quality report will be published on our website by the end of September.
