TRAVEL PLAN & PARKING

Police Scotland have assured school staff that there will be an increased police presence around the school at drop off and collection times over the next few days. This is in response to an incident between adults at drop off time on Monday morning of this week which many of you will have seen reported in the press.

School staff handle several complaints every week in relation to parking to drop off at school and when necessary contact the police for support as we cannot police the behaviour of parents/carers on the public highways around the school.

We do however want all of our children to arrive at school safely and not become stressed or anxious because they have witnessed verbally or physically abusive incidents between adults. No child should be exposed to violent or aggressive behaviour and as a community it is our responsibility to work together to ensure they are not.

Parking outside schools is the responsibility of parents and carers and we work very hard to ensure that anyone who is dropping off their children at school does so with the safety of children and staff of the school in mind. School staff are present around the drop off zone and school gates from 8.45am to welcome children into school. This system works well and with everyone's cooperation and should help minimise the need to park at all.

For parents who prefer to park their vehicle, there is ample parking around the school if everyone allowed themselves the time to take a short walk from the car to the school gates. Please allow yourself the few extra minutes it may take to park safely without obstructing home owners' driveways.

During the week of 20th March children at all stages of the school will be working with the Community Safety team to raise awareness of safe routes to school and promote positive attitudes to car travel, safe parking and safe walking routes to school. Please help us with this work considering walking to school when possible, parking responsibly when it is necessary to park and help us to make sure everyone can travel to school and work safely.

Congratulations to our P7 athletics team who were invited to represent Glasgow at the West of Scotland finals last month. Our team gave a terrific effort and were placed 9th overall against some very tough competition, we are extremely proud of them.

On 24^{th} February our cross country team, made up of children from P5 and P6, took part in the Glasgow cross country running championship. The children were challenged to run a mile cross country course in their fastest time. The competition involves hundreds of children from around the city and Garrowhill were very proud of our pupils. PUPIL EQUITY FUND
