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#### Dear Parents/Carers

## SCHOOL CLASSIFICATION FOR 2016 SESSION

As many of you will know, each year a maximum intake cap is set for schools. This is to ensure school capacity is not exceeded now or in the future and that we are compliant with 2014 Scottish Government Guidelines on working capacity and the maintenance of teaching spaces to enable us to deliver a full and effective curriculum.

This year our school intake has been capped at 63 taking our roll for August 2016 to 422.

Throughout this month staff will be working together to organise the children into classes for August. It is likely we will have 3 P1 classes and at least 2 composite classes at other stages in the school. Where there is no need to re-arrange a year group into different classes we will not do so.

We will write to you before the end of May to advise you of your child's class and teacher for the new session.

# NEW P1 INTAKE INDUCTION DAYS

Now that decisions have been made on placing requests we are able to invite our new P1 pupils into school for their first induction visits where they will meet their teacher and new classmates. The children will be invited in on one of three dates in May in their new class groups. Parents will have the opportunity to order uniform with our supplier BARU on these days. The visits are planned for the afternoons of  $17^{th}$ ,  $18^{th}$  and  $19^{th}$  May at  $1.30 \, \text{pm}$ . This allows us to meet the children one class at a time and reduces the gueue for sizing uniform.

The families of all children who have a P1 place with us will receive a letter in the post advising of the date of their visit.

#### SPRING FAIR

Our Fundraising Committee are organising this year's Spring Fair which will take place on Saturday 7<sup>th</sup> May from 10am until 1pm. Lots of exciting stalls and events are planned for the day including football, slides, hot food and lots more. If you feel you can offer any help on the day call our school



office who will pass on your details to the committee. A flyer with more detailed information on the day will be sent home with children after the Spring break and further details will be posted on our website.

## PRIMARY 7 END OF YEAR ARRANGEMENTS

#### OFFICIAL OPENING CEREMONY



All children will be present and invited guests include representatives of the community, church and parents. #### SCHOOL OUTING

The cost of this for each child will be £10 and a separate letter will be issued later this week to each child asking you to indicate your consent for your child to attend. #### TRAVEL PLAN & PARKING



apologise on behalf of our parent forum. There is ample parking in the streets surrounding our school and our drop off point in school works very well in the morning with staff there to support children's safe entry to school from 8.50am each day.

Blocking another person's access or exit from their home is unreasonable and unacceptable behaviour. Please support your child and the school by parking appropriately.

# COLLECTING/DROPPING OFF AT SCHOOL

If when dropping off at school you prefer to wait around the perimeter fence to observe your child in the playground, please make sure the pavement is not blocked for other children arriving. A busy footpath can be intimidating to some children even when they are with an adult. Too many adults on one spot on the pavement increases the risk to children as they may have to walk too close to the kerb to pass. Please be observant and leave plenty of space for children to walk to school and access our gates safely.

When collecting from school it is important that all pre-school children are supervised and remain with an adult at all times. The grass embankment around the playground has a steep slope towards the fence. Young children cannot control their momentum if they start down this hill and they are then at risk of colliding with the fence or being jagged by nettles at the bottom of the slope. We would also ask all adults to stay back from the building and the windows when waiting for children and keep the exit pathways clear.

#### HEALTH WEEK

This week is health week in school where we focus learning around all aspects of health. Mrs Vickers is coordinating the week's events and include children having taster sessions in judo and massage as well as input from other health professional to support healthy choices with food and lifestyle. During the week all classes in the school will complete their Sexual Health & Relationship lessons as part of the progressive programme of work children began in their P1 year. Children should keep a pair of shorts and a t-shirt in their bags each day this week as they may be needed for some of the activities.

#### CHILD PROTECTION: ABSENCE FROM SCHOOL

Please phone the dedicated absence team based at 220 High Street on <u>287 0039</u> from 8 am on the first day of any absence and every subsequent day. It is important that families inform the absence line before 9am if a child cannot attend school. This prevents school staff raising a concern because a child has not arrived as expected in school at 9am.



A letter explaining the reason for absence should be provided to the school on your child's return from absence.

#### MAY/JUNE ELECTIONS AND CLOSURES

Please remember that our school is used as a polling place on  $5^{th}$  May. This is an in-service day for staff and children should not attend.

On June 23<sup>rd</sup> the school will also be used as a polling place for the European Elections. Following consultation with the Constituency Manager, it was agreed that it would not be appropriate for children to attend school on this day. Staff will use this time for further in-service training in the building.

All parents are advised to make alternative child care arrangements for Thursday 23rd June.

#### **BOOK FAIR**

From Tuesday 3<sup>rd</sup> May - Monday 9<sup>th</sup> May the school will host a book fair from Travelling Books. Children will have the chance to view books and take a brochure home with guidance on how to order should you wish to buy one. This is a 100% commission meaning the school will receive books for our library to the value of any purchases.

#### FUNDRAISING COMMITTEE SUPPORT

The Garrowhill Fundraising Committee meet regularly to plan and coordinate events aimed at not only raising funds to support learning experiences but also to involve children in their community. The children and staff would like to express their thanks to the contribution the committee makes to improving learning experiences in the school. This term alone classes will benefit from the Living Eggs project, Insect Lore, Zoolab and Hoots Owls. All have costs associated with them that our core budget cannot always cover and the benefit to the children's learning is tremendous. The committee also support the P7 leaving arrangements both financially and with the offer of organisational help and have contributed to our Christmas and Easter celebrations. Many thanks to everyone who gives their time to help with the work of the committee and helps us make learning a little more exciting.
