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Dear Parents/Carers

TRANSITIONS

Enrolment for children due to begin P1 in August 2017 will take place throughout the week beginning 7th November. If you have or know of a child due to enrol for school, please contact the school office to arrange a suitable time to complete the enrolment process. Your child's birth certificate and a utility bill showing your address must be brought to this appointment. All children must enrol at their catchment school. Parents who wish to make a placing request to an alternative school can indicate their intention at enrolment and compete a placing request form.

Please refer to the **Glasgow City Council Website** "School Enrolment" for further information on making a placing request and how to obtain an application form or apply on line.

Primary 7 pupils were issued with their transition to secondary school paperwork on $31^{s\dagger}$ October. Please complete this and return by the 11^{th} November.

Our associated secondary school is Bannerman High. Bannerman High is a delineated school which means it has a catchment area in the same way as the primary schools. Primary 7 pupils who do not live in the Bannerman Catchment area but who wish to attend the school must make a placing request to do so, even if they attend an associated primary school.

Please note, children who attend a school by a Placing Request are <u>not</u> <u>entitled</u> to free school transport.

OPEN AFTERNOONS

Open afternoons in your child's class is an opportunity to visit the school and take time with your child to discuss their learning and progress with them in the school environment. Some parents have the view that these events are unnecessary as parents have taken time from work and do not get to speak to class teachers. However, many families do enjoy visiting the school to review children's work with them and for this reason we intend to continue to offer the opportunity. We understand that working parents are not able to take time off from work and have explained to all children that when an adult cannot come to school, the children will take the work home to look through at the end of that week.

SCHOOL TRAVEL PLAN AND SAFE ROUTES TO SCHOOL

Many thanks to those of you who have continued to work with our JRSOs and community safety team to make sure our children can travel to and arrive safely at school.

Unfortunately the behaviour of some drivers is still posing a risk to pedestrians due to their insistence on parking at the entrance to the park or mounting pavements when driving and parking. Details of these drivers, their car registrations and descriptions of their aggressive behaviour are forwarded to the police when we have them.

The entrance at Maxwell Road is one of two pedestrian entrances that we have, Please do not stand at this entrance when dropping off as we have received complaints from the public that the footpath is difficult to pass. Mums with prams trying to access the nursery can find this particularly challenging. If you must observe your child in the playground before 9am, it would help if parents dropped children off and moved on further along the street or into the park.

All parents should continue to remind children that once dropped off at school they must not leave the school grounds. There are staff in the grounds to assist if they need help with anything.

CHRISTMAS CAROL SERVICE

Last year we held our very first Christmas Carol Service in our new school hall and were able to invite a limited number of parents. During our Carol Service we decorate the Christmas Tree and each year group sings one of their favourite carols.

Our Carol Service will take place on Monday 5th December at 9.30am in our assembly hall. We are only able to accommodate 80 guests at this event. Tickets will be issued on a first come first served basis to parents/carers. The fairest way to do this is by telephone as request slips/order forms can be lost or delayed in transit.

Parents who wish tickets for the Carol Service should call the school on Thursday <u>10th November</u> (maximum of 2 per family). Do not call before this date as tickets will not be ready.

Please understand that we cannot exceed an allocation of 80 due to the capacity of our hall.

GROWTH MIND-SET

Thank you to those parents and families who expressed an interest in the Growth Mind-set work the school are undertaking.

The first of our workshops will take place on Wednesday 23rd November at 7.30pm in the school hall. The session should last for approximately 45 minutes and is for adults only. The aim is to raise awareness of the growth mind-set work the school has undertaken in the last year, look at how this impacts on learning in the classroom and at home and participate in some of the challenges faced by children in school.
