SPORTS DAY

Weather permitting our Sports Day will take place on Friday 12th June. As we do not yet have use of all of our grounds, events will take place in the playground and be in the format of a 'potted sports' with children completing activities at stations organised around the playground with some in the halls.

Our children have been organised into 16 teams according to their House Groups. Children in P1-3 will complete their sports day activities from 9.25 until 10.30. Children in P4-7 will complete theirs from 11-12.15.

Parents are welcome to spectate at the appropriate times but as we have limited space please limit the number of <u>adults per child</u> to two. Spectators must remain in the designated spectator areas which will be the grassed areas and will be clearly marked. Some events will take place in the school hall and spectators will not be able to view these. It is important and in the interests of safety that spectators do not approach children or enter the school building during this event.

Thank you for your co-operation while we operate with restricted space.

SUMMER FAIR

Our Fundraising Committee have been hard at work organising a summer fair to raise funds for our school. The funds raised by the committee help to enhance our children's learning through provision of resources, equipment and experiences we could not otherwise afford.

CHILD PROTECTION: ABSENCE FROM SCHOOL

Please phone the dedicated absence team based at 220 High Street on <u>287 0039</u> from 8 am on the first day of absence and every subsequent day. A letter explaining the reason for absence should be provided to the school on your child's return from absence.



Use the absence reporting line to report the following absences:

- Sickness absence: if the absence lasts more than one day, parents and carers are required to call on subsequent days to provide an update. A letter should be provided to the school when the child returns from their absence.
- Medical or dental appointments: Parents and carers should call the team to report absences for medical or dental appointments. The school requires a letter or appointment card as evidence of the appointment to ensure permission is given to be absent from class.

Please phone the school directly to report the following absences:

To make sure you receive the right support you require, parents and carers should still contact the school directly to report absences of a sensitive or personal nature, for example:

- Bereavement
- Serious illness, for example, an absence which is going to last more than one week
- Injury, for example, broken limb
- Contagious diseases or illness

SCHOOL MEALS AND CLOTHING GRANTS

Many families may qualify for free school meals and clothing grants and are not yet taking advantage of this option.
