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#### Dear Parents/Carers

#### CELEBRATING ACHIEVEMENT

In our parent survey which was completed in March, we asked for your views on prize giving and the school's practice of having a 'Prize Giving Ceremony' at the end of June. Two thirds of parents who responded agreed that children's achievements should be rewarded as they progress but were concerned that the current format could affect the self-esteem and motivation of many children. There is a strong feeling from staff and representatives of our parent council that current arrangements do not promote the principles of a Curriculum for Excellence and are not in keeping with the belief that every child has the right to have their achievements recognised. Children report that they enjoy being rewarded for their effort and achievement throughout the year.

With these views in mind, we have reviewed our policy on how we celebrate achievement to include regular and on-going awards for progress and effort as follows:

- Weekly pupil of the week award (certificate) to a child from every class for effort leading to improvement in a particular curricular area: i.e science
- Author of the month: to a child from each class who has made greatest improvement with creative
- Mathemagician: a monthly award to a child from each class who is showing strengths with an aspect of maths
- Winning house: weekly award to the House who has worked to gain most points for their team

From August 2015 we will make every effort to invite parents of the monthly award winners to our Friday assembly to join in the celebration of achievement for their child.

Our end of year service in June will no longer be a prize giving ceremony but will be a celebration of our Primary 7 children's achievements in completing this 'Broad General' phase of their education. Arrangements for our P7 Leavers' Service on 23rd June are:

- All classes in school to attend Mure memorial Church at 1.15 on 23<sup>rd</sup> June
- Only Parents/Carers of P7 children to attend. (tickets to be allocated)
- P7 will give a presentation on their memories and achievements
- Every P7 pupil will be called upon to accept their individual award for completion of the primary phase of their education
- Macdonald Salver to be awarded to the P7 pupil voted for by children and staff as an outstanding
- Other awards to P7 pupils will include a literacy and numeracy prize, a science and technology prize, and an award for sport.

We feel taking this action responds appropriately to the concerns and views held by our staff, children and parents and goes some way to promoting a positive self-esteem in all learners. A separate letter will be issued to P7 families with ticket arrangements for the service and the buffet which will follow it.

#### CHILD PROTECTION: ABSENCE FROM SCHOOL

# From 1<sup>st</sup> June parents and carers should follow the guidance below to report pupil absences from school:



A pupil absence reporting line has been created to provide an efficient flexible way for parents/carers to report absence. Customer and Business Support Services recognise that in some circumstances, for example, to report or discuss a sensitive issue, you may still require to speak directly with the school. The following guidance should be followed:

Please phone the dedicated absence team based at 220 High Street on 287 0039 from 8 am on the first day of absence and every subsequent day. A letter explaining the reason for absence should be provided to the school on your child's return from absence.

Use the absence reporting line to report the following absences:

**Sickness absence:** if the absence lasts more than one day, parents and carers are required to call on subsequent days to provide an update.

**Medical or dental appointments:** Parents and carers should call the team to report absences for medical or dental appointments. The school requires a letter or appointment card as evidence of the appointment to ensure permission is given to be absent from class.

#### Please phone the school directly to report the following absences:

To make sure you receive the right support you require, parents and carers should still contact the school directly to report absences of a sensitive or personal nature, for example:

- Bereavement
- $\rightarrow$  Serious illness, for example, an absence which is going to last more than one week
- → Injury, for example, broken limb
- → Contagious diseases or illness

The pupil absence service is provided by a dedicated team of experienced Education support staff. The information you provide to the team is updated in the school's system when you call, so the school is immediately aware of all absence information.

Your support of the new service is much appreciated.

School staff will text you a reminder of the number and start date of this service prior to its launch.

#### PEER MEDIATION

Interviews have now taken place for our peer mediator team. Congratulations to all senior pupils who put themselves forward for this role and went through the interview process.

Mediators are trained to help other children resolve conflict in a positive way and promote skills in listening to the views of others. All peer mediators will be issued with a baseball cap to make them easily identifiable in the playground. This is an important role and complements the work children in all classes have undertaken to help them understand that solutions can be found to problems if we talk them through calmly.
